High school seniors graduating in 2021 may be eligible for six (6) college credits per semester tuition free. 2020 seniors need to inquire with OCCC's admissions department about receiving the tuition waiver. See back of flier for enrollment information for high school students. OCCC general education course tuition for Oklahoma residents is \$100.84* per credit.

*Tuition rate effective 2/27/19 and are subject to change. Seniors are still responsible for fees of \$34.45 per credit and any required book(s).

Do you plan to enroll in college courses at Oklahoma City Community College while you are still in high school to earn dual credit? If so, follow these simple steps:

1. Complete the Application for Admission recruit-web.occc.edu/Ellucian.ERecruiting.Web. External/Pages/Welcome.aspx

The Application for Admission is required for all new students. Once you complete and submit your application, you can view possible additional items needed to complete the process.

2. Request an official transcript from your high school

The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education (OSRHE) require that all concurrent students submit an official transcript before getting admitted. You can bring your transcript and additional documents to the OCCC Office of Recruitment & Admissions or have your high school send it.

3. Submit official ACT scores

In order to be eligible to enroll in concurrent classes, you must have taken the ACT. Official ACT scores must be submitted before you can be admitted. Visit *act.org* or *studentscores.collegeboard.org/home* for more information or visit with your high school counselor.

4. Speak to your high school counselor to see if you qualify

The OSRHE have strict eligibility requirements for students who wish to enroll in college courses while still in high school. If you meet the minimum requirements, you should speak with your high school counselor to discuss your options for enrolling concurrently.

5. Get approval from your high school and parents/guardians

If you have met the OSRHE requirements, and your high school approves you to enroll concurrently, you will need to submit OCCC's Concurrent Enrollment Form.

This form must be completed by the high school, including signatures from the principal and counselor, and be signed by you and your parent or guardian.
